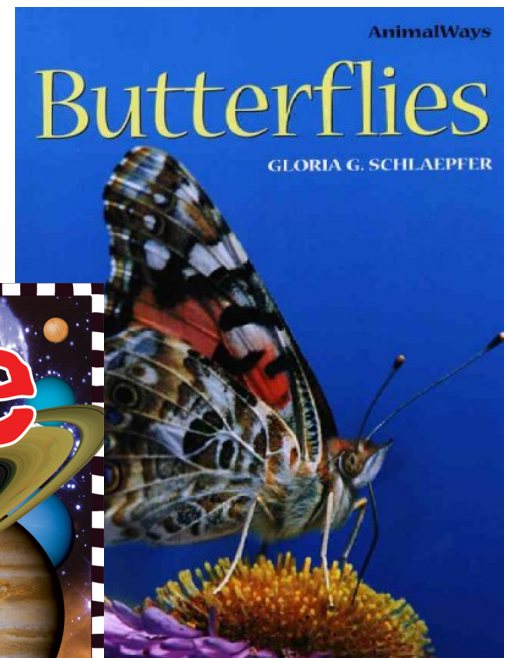
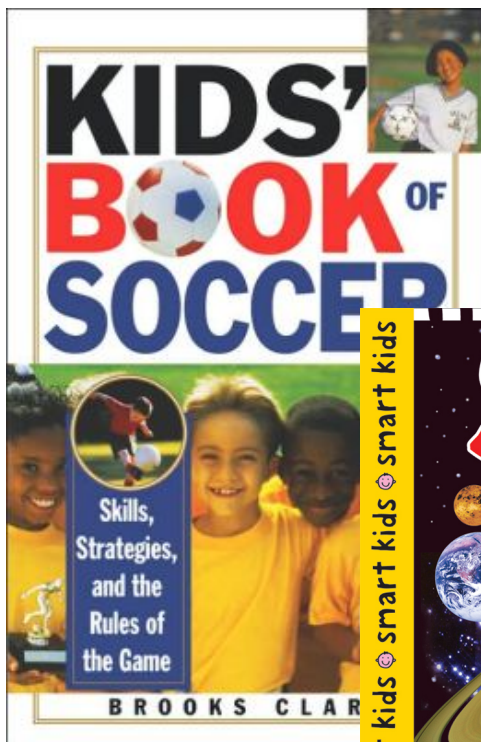
# historical fiction

A fictional story with real or imagined characters that takes places during a real historical time period.



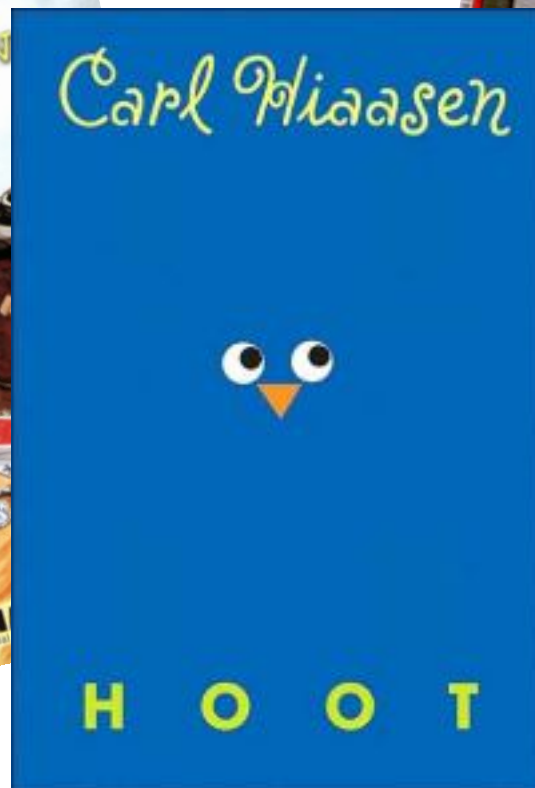
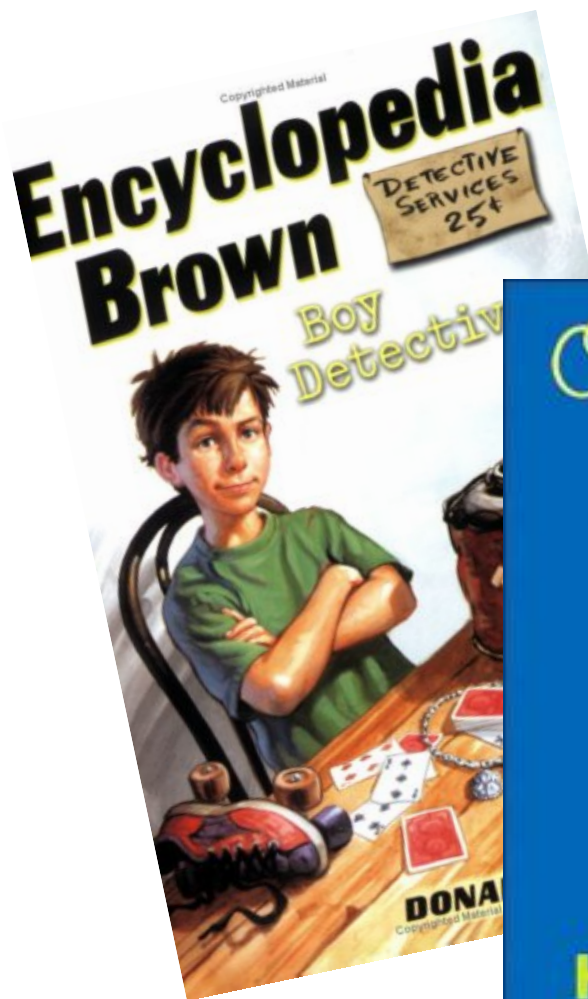
# Informational Nonfiction

Text that provides facts about a topic or variety of topics such as sports, animals, weather, countries, space, travel, etc.



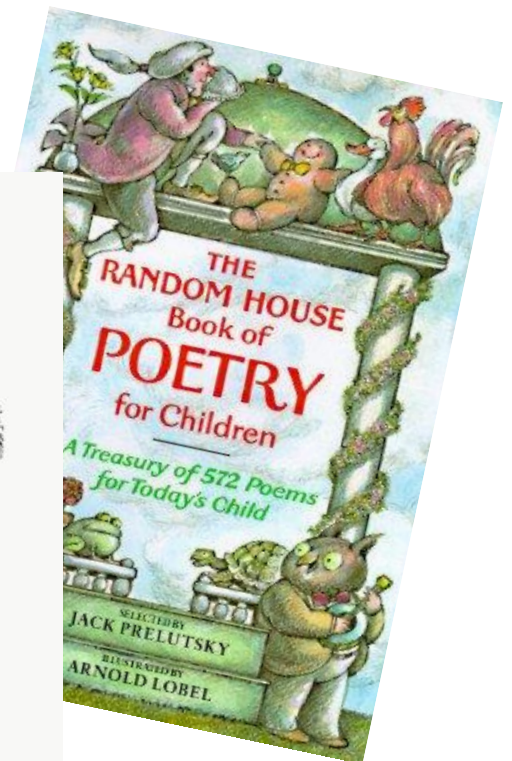
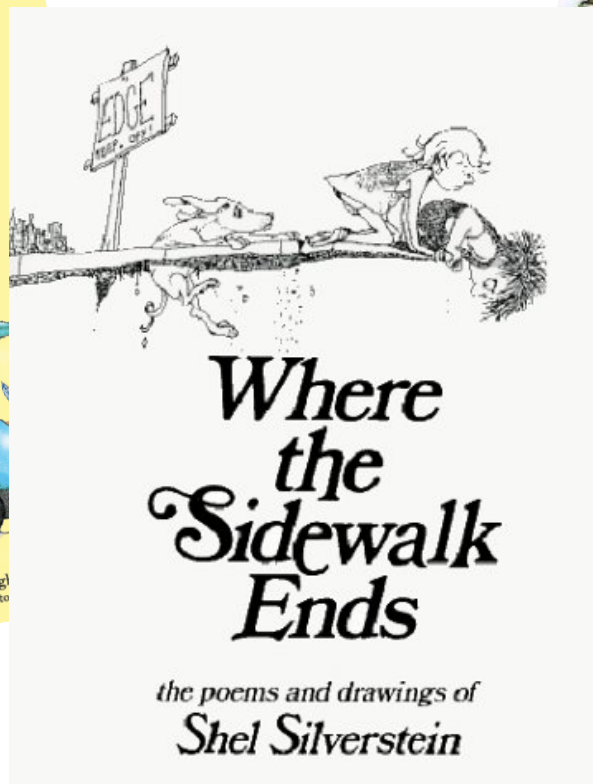
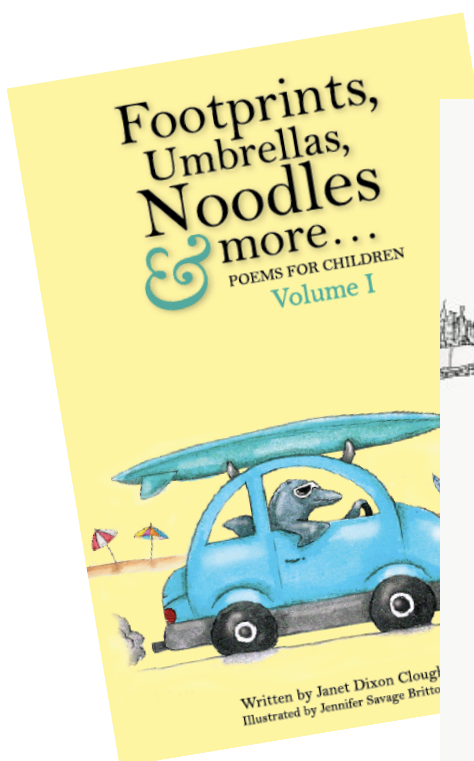
# Mystery

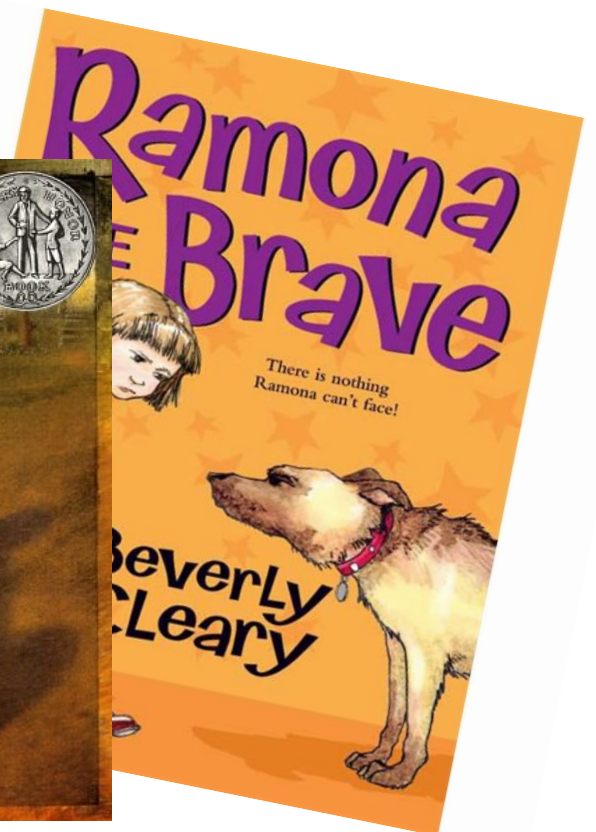
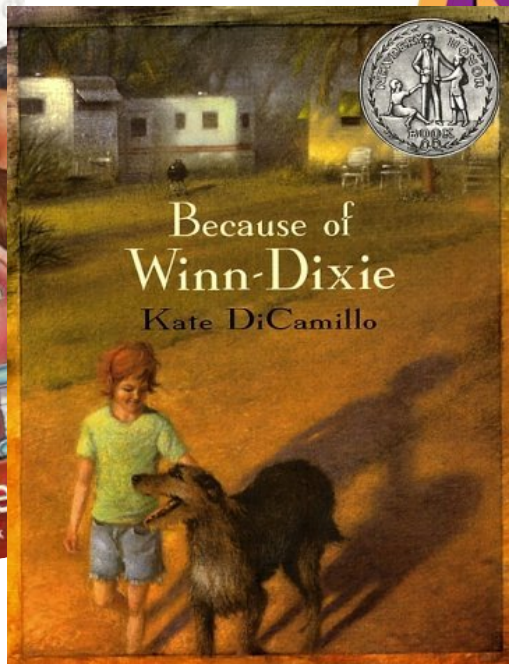
Verse written to create a response from the reader. Often incorporates elements such as rhythm, rhyme, and figurative language.

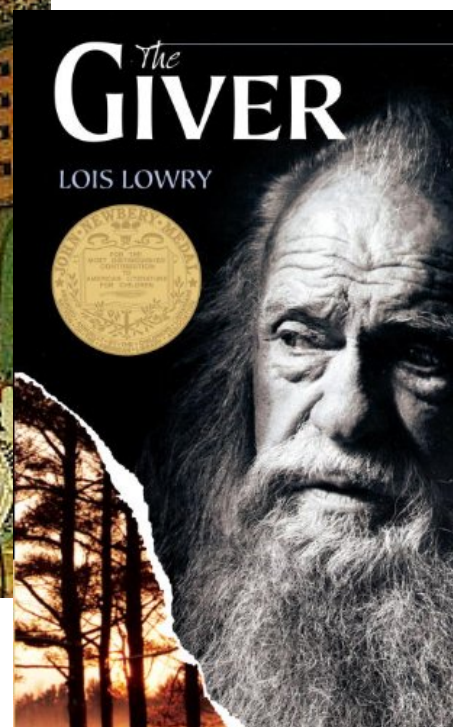
A story using made up characters and sometimes settings but could happen in real life.





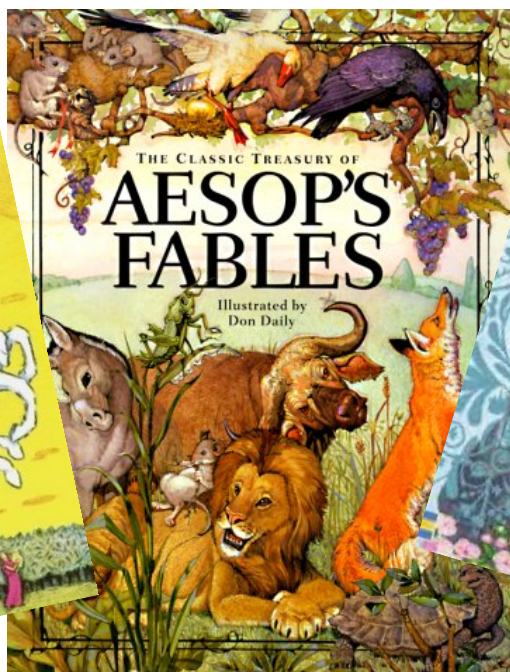
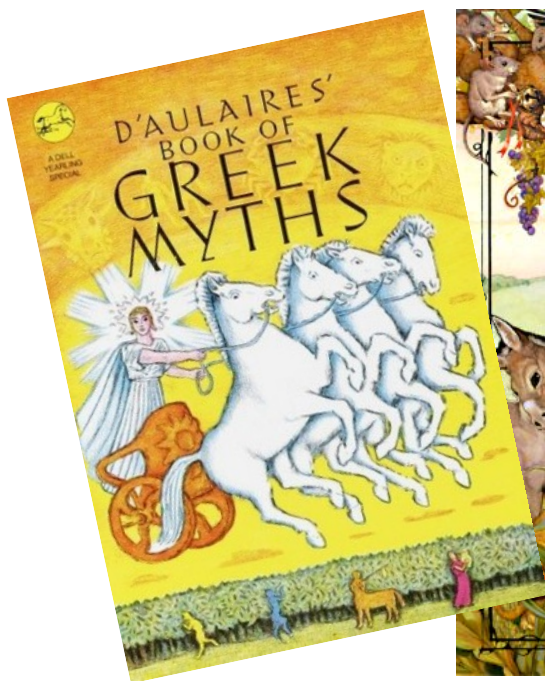
# SCIENCE FICTION
