<p><b><u>O</u>ccasion:</b> <i>Time, place, and setting of this document. Speech? Critique? Argument?</i></p>		
<p><b><u>A</u>udience:</b> <i>Whom is the document directed towards?</i></p>		
<p><b><u>P</u>urpose:</b> <i>The reason the document is written. Inform about what? Complain about what? To explain what?</i></p>		
<p><b><u>S</u>ubject:</b> <i>The issue at hand. Example: right to die, racism, poverty, etc.</i></p>		
<p><b><u>T</u>one:</b> <i>Attitude of the speaker towards his subjects and audience.</i></p>		
<p><b>Stylistic Devices:</b> <i>Diction, imagery, syntax, organization, figurative language.</i></p>		
<p><b>Rhetorical Techniques:</b> <i>Narration, exposition, description, and persuasion. Definition, statistics, research, and irony etc.</i></p>
